Population and Fertility Trends

- Macro-level issues influence population growth
- Access to birth control
- China's one child policy
- General fertility rate (includes women ages 15 to 44)
 - # of children born per 1,00 women
 - Better than other methods like "crude fertility rate" (per 1,00 people)

Fertility in the US

- Pronatalism
- Miscarriage
- Delayed parenthood
 - 1971 around 21. Around 2012 25.4 years old.

Costs and Rewards

- Economic (direct costs) and opportunity costs (lack of flexible schedule)
- Rewards
 - 85% of parents said the relationship with children was the most fulfilling.
 - 23% said career.

Enrichment

Caring for the child would bring me happiness.

Parenting the child would be rewarding.

My spouse/partner and I would grow closer together through the experience.

Parenting the child would make me a better person.

Isolation

I would have less time to spend doing what I enjoy.

Caring for the child would interfere with the time I want to spend with my spouse.

Commitment

Parenting the child would be a never-ending responsibility.

The child would be dependent on me.

Instrumental Costs

Raising the child would be financially expensive.

Parenting the child would be emotionally exhausting.

Caring for the child would be physically exhausting.

Continuity

I would look forward to being a grandparent in the future.

Our relationship would change over the years from parent to friend.

The child would carry on my family name.

Perceived Support

My friends and family would help me care for the child.

My family and friends would provide social support.

Childfree

- The rate of childfree individuals has remained about the same, depending on the economic/historical period
- I 6% of women between the ages of 40 and 44
- Hispanics least likely to be childfree

Infertility Issues


- Surrogacy
 - Legal issues such as abortion
 - Unregulated
- Assisted Reproductive Technology (ART) includes all fertility treatments
- In vitro fertilization is the most common
 - Ovulation stimulation drugs, eggs removed and fertilized in a dish with sperm, implanted in uterus
 - 1/4 to 1/3 result in birth
 - How many embryos should be implanted?

Infertility Issues

- Financial
- Loss of pregnancy and birth
- Loss of parenting
- Loss of self-worth

Childbirth

- Stages of pregnancy
- Stages of labor
 - First: Cervix dilates, contractions
 - Second: Pushing and delivery, may have episiotomy (cut)
 - Third: Delivery of the placenta
- Wait six weeks before exercising or sexual activity



Childbirth

- Stages of pregnancy
- Stages of labor
- Medicalization of childbirth
 - Around 33% of all US births, which is a 50 percent increase since early 2000
 - Birth centers
 - Doulas
 - Midwives

Adoption

- Closed
- Open
- International
- Gays and Lesbians
 - Ban lifted in Florida in 2010

Transition to Parenthood

- Lack of sleep
 - Example: Breastfeeding every 2-6 hours
- Little experience in childcare
- Change in couple's relationship
- Sometimes takes awhile to feel like a parent/emotionally bond with child
- Women more likely to suffer from post partum depression when they feel lack of support
