

# Should

- How do we form statements, questions and answers with '**should**'? Study the grammar reference chart below.

● <b>Affirmative and Negative Statements</b> with ' <i>should</i> '		
<b>I</b> <b>You</b> <b>He / She / It</b> <b>We</b> <b>They</b>	<b>should</b>	<b>go home.</b>
	<b>should not</b> (shouldn't)	

● <b>Questions</b> with ' <i>should</i> '		
<b>Should</b>	<b>I</b> <b>you</b> <b>he / she / it</b> <b>we</b> <b>they</b>	<b>go home?</b>

● <b>Affirmative ('Yes') answers</b> with ' <i>should</i> '		
Yes,	<b>I</b> <b>you</b> <b>he / she / it</b> <b>we</b> <b>they</b>	<b>should.</b>

● <b>Negative ('No') answers</b> with ' <i>should</i> '		
No,	<b>I</b> <b>you</b> <b>he / she / it</b> <b>we</b> <b>they</b>	<b>should not.</b> (shouldn't)

● <b>Information Questions</b> with ' <i>should</i> '			
<b>*What</b> <b>When</b> <b>Where</b> <b>Why</b> <b>How</b> <b>**Who ... with</b>	<b>should</b>	<b>I</b> <b>you</b> <b>he / she / it</b> <b>we</b> <b>they</b>	<b>go home?</b>

**\*What** should you do?    **\*\*Who** should go home?
