Present Simple Tense

The tense that is used to refer to <u>events</u>, <u>actions</u>, and <u>conditions</u> that are happening <u>all the time</u> or exist now.



Third person

We add...

-IES (Consonant + Y)



He runs every morning She sings very good It rains a lot



Isabel studies every night The baby cries all the time.



We add...

-ES (-ss, -o, -x, -sh, -ch)

He ki**sses** her She fi**xes** the car She wat**ches** TV

be \rightarrow is have \rightarrow has

Present Continuous Verbs

(Adding -ing to verbs)

Conjugation (Present Continuous)

The present continuous is made from the **present tense of the verb** <u>be</u> and the <u>-ing form</u> of a verb:



If the verb ends with...

-E

We are making a chocolate cake. I am taking medicine She is not living in Mérida





-W, X, Y

He is fixing his bike It is snowing outside We are enjoying this great weather consonant + vowel + consonant (E.g. S<u>top</u>)

We are planning a surprise party I am sitting next to Mark She is swimming in the river

consonant + vowel + consonant Two syllable verb (E.g. Happen)

> What is happening? They are Offering a discount
